Public Notices for Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders

The following public notices were served on **Thursday 14th May 2026**:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Milton Keynes City Council intends, in not less than seven days from the date of this Notice, to make the following Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984:

PUBLIC NOTICE:

MILTON KEYNES CITY COUNCIL (SOUTH LAWNE, BLETCHLEY) (TEMPORARY CLOSURE) ORDER 2026 (Reference TTRO-2378)

The effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit vehicles from proceeding along the following part of road to allow Openreach to lay ducts safely.

South Lawne, Bletchley – From number 14 to number 26.

Whilst the above length of road is closed, the alternative route will be via Rickey Lane.

The closure will be in effect between 27th and 29th May 2026.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Milton Keynes City Council has on 5th May 2026, made the following Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984:

PUBLIC NOTICE:

MILTON KEYNES CITY COUNCIL (LEYS ROAD, LOUGHTON) (TEMPORARY CLOSURE) ORDER 2026 (Reference TTRO – 2397)

The effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit vehicles from proceeding along the following part of road to allow Openreach to lay ducts safely.

Ley Road, Loughton – From School Lane to Bradwell Road.

Whilst the above length of road is closed, the alternative route will be via Bradwell Road, Church Lane and School Lane (and vice versa).

The closure will be in effect between 15th and 19th May 2026.

PUBLIC NOTICE:

MILTON KEYNES CITY COUNCIL (BUCKINGHAM STREET AND CHURCH STREET (PARTS), WOLVERTON) (TEMPORARY CLOSURES) ORDER 2026 (Reference TTRO-2410)

The effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit vehicles from proceeding along the following part of road to allow Graham Construction to undertake works in conjunction with the Agora redevelopment.

Buckingham Street, Wolverton – its rear/side access road between numbers 56 and 68.

Whilst the above length of road is closed, the alternative route will be via Cambridge Street and Buckingham Street (and vice versa).

Church Street, Wolverton – Its eastbound carriageway from Radcliffe Street to Creed Street

Whilst the above length of road is closed, the alternative route will be via Radcliffe Street, Stratford Road and Creed Street.

The closure will be in effect between 18th May and 15th August 2026.

PUBLIC NOTICE:

MILTON KEYNES CITY COUNCIL (WILDACRE ROAD, SHENLEY WOOD) (TEMPORARY CLOSURE) ORDER 2026 (Reference TTRO-2399)

The effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit vehicles from proceeding along the following part of road to allow Hickford Construction to overlay and plane out the existing carriageway.

Wildacre Road, Shenley Wood – Its entire length.

Whilst the above length of road is closed, the alternative route will be via Chalkdell Drive and Childs Way (and vice versa).

The closure will be in effect between 18th and 29th May 2026.

PUBLIC NOTICE:

MILTON KEYNES CITY COUNCIL (DELAWARE DRIVE, TONGWELL) (TEMPORARY CLOSURE) ORDER 2026 (Reference TTRO-2376)

The effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit vehicles from proceeding along the following part of road to allow Reynolds Groundwork Services to undertake works to the carriageway bellmouth.

Delaware Drive, Tongwell – From Tongwell Street for 90 metres on its eastbound carriageway.

Whilst the above length of road is closed, the alternative route will be via Tongwell Street and Danstead Way (and vice versa).

The closure will be in effect between 18th May and 5th June 2026.

PUBLIC NOTICE:

MILTON KEYNES CITY COUNCIL (CAVENHAM, TWO MILE ASH) (TEMPORARY CLOSURE) ORDER 2026 (Reference TTRO-2360)

The effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit vehicles from proceeding along the following part of road to allow Openreach to undertake ducting works.

Cavenham, Two Mile Ash – Outside number 13.

Whilst the above length of road is closed, there will be no alternative route.

The closure will be in effect between 18th and 20th May 2026.

PUBLIC NOTICE:

MILTON KEYNES CITY COUNCIL (GRIZEDALE, HEELANDS) (TEMPORARY CLOSURE) ORDER 2026 (Reference TTRO-2370)

The effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit vehicles from proceeding along the following part of road to allow Openreach to undertake ducting works.

Grizedale, Heelands – From number 6 to number 15.

Whilst the above length of road is closed, there will be no alternative route.

The closure will be in effect between 20th and 22nd May 2026.

Public Notices for Permanent Traffic Regulation Orders

The following public notices were served on **Thursday 14th May 2026**:

PUBLIC NOTICE:

MILTON KEYNES CITY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, MILTON KEYNES) (40 MPH AND 50 MPH SPEED RESTRICTION) ORDER 2026 (Reference TRO – 472)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Milton Keynes City Council has on **12th May 2026** made the above Traffic Regulation Order, under Sections 84(1), (2), (3) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The general effect of the above made Order will be:

- To revoke the current Order entitled “**Milton Keynes City Council (Various Roads, Haversham) (50 mph Speed Restriction) Order 2024**” and consolidate the 50mph speed restrictions along parts of Bullington End Road and Wolverton Road (Castletorpe), Park Road (Hanslope and Hanslope Park) and the unnamed road that links Tathall End and Haversham;
- To revoke the existing 40mph speed limit on the unnamed road that links High Street and Wolverton Road, Haversham – this part of the unnamed road will become 30mph by virtue of street lighting;
- To introduce 40mph speed restrictions along parts of Haversham Road (Haversham), Park Road and Newport Road (Hanslope, Hanslope Park and Tathall End), the unnamed road that links Tathall End and Hanslope Park and the unnamed road that links Tathall End and Gayhurst.

The made Order will take effect on **15th May 2026**.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the made Order or any provision contained in the Orders on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any Instrument made under the Act has not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for that purpose.
