26/00739/LB	Application for listed building consent for the repair and partial replacement of existing timber sash windows on a window-bywindow basis, including retention of sound frames and replacement of deteriorated sash elements with new timber components to match the existing design, proportions and detailing. Alteration of an existing non-original basement window opening to form a new timber door, including removal of the existing UPVC unit and installation of a timber-framed door to match the character and detailing of the building, at 8 St Johns Terrace, Blackfriars Road, King's Lynn, Norfolk
26/00740/LB	This application seeks consent for a programme of essential conservation and repair works at the Carnegie Library, Kings Lynn, focused on arresting decay and improving weather resistance. Key works include localized repairs to the roof tiles, leadwork, and gutters, the restoration of timber ventilation lanterns and windows, and targeted repointing of chimney stacks. The proposal also includes structural crack repairs and the installation of reversible internal features to facilitate continued community use during the project, ensuring all interventions utilize traditional materials to preserve the building's historic fabric at Norfolk County Council Library, London Road, King's Lynn, Norfolk
