



**NOTICE OF MAKING OF PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDERS
THE WORCESTER CITY COUNCIL (FOOTPATH WR-858)
PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER 2026 ("THE WR-858 ORDER")
AND**

**THE WORCESTER CITY COUNCIL (FOOTPATH WR-678)
PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER 2026 ("THE WR-678 ORDER")**

TAKE NOTICE THAT:

1. Worcester City Council has carried out the necessary consultations on its proposals to make the WR-858 Order and WR-678 Order (together "the Orders") in accordance with section 72 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Crime and Policing Act 2014 ("the Act").
2. The Orders were made on the 18th August 2026 in accordance with section 59 of the Act and come into force on the 4th September 2026 and will continue to have effect for a period of two years thereafter unless extended by further orders under the Council's statutory powers.
3. The effect of the WR-858 Order is to restrict the public right away across Footpath WR-858 (known as Brickfields Crossing) at all times and to all persons.
4. The effect of the WR-678 Order is to restrict the public right away across Footpath WR-678 (known as Kays Crossing) at all times and to all persons.

6. Under the provisions of section 66 of the Act an interested person may apply to the High Court within 6 weeks from the date of the Orders were made to question the validity of the Orders on the grounds that:
 - a) That the Council did not have the power to make the order or to include particular prohibitions or requirements imposed by the Orders;
 - b) That a requirement under Chapter 2 of the Act was not complied with in relation to the Orders.
7. An interested person is defined by section 66(2) of the Act as being an individual who lives in the restricted area (as defined in the Orders) or who regularly works or visits that area.
