Warwickshire County Council has made the following Temporary Traffic Orders:

PUBLIC FOOTPATH FROM LEIGH CRESCENT TO STOCKTON ROAD, LONG ITCHINGTON

Order Effect: Footpath closed to all traffic.

Reason for Order: To enable telegraph pole replacement.

Order Commences: 1 October 2026 for up to 6 months.

Anticipated Completion: 1 October 2026.

Access & Diversion: Leigh Crescent, Stockton Road and vice versa.

Warwickshire County Council proposes to make the following Temporary Traffic Orders:

KNIGHTCOTE ROAD, BISHOPS ITCHINGTON

Order Effect: Road closed to vehicular traffic.

Reason for Order: To enable telegraph pole renewal works.

Order Commences: 16 October 2026 for up to 18 months.

Anticipated Completion: 16 October 2026.

Access & Diversion: Knightcote Road, Northend Road, Blacksmiths Lane, Bottom Street, Dasset Road, Village Road, Banbury Road, Gaydon Road and vice versa.

For all of the above temporary orders, pedestrian access to and egress from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of road to be closed will be maintained at all times. Vehicular access will be maintained where possible.

(30 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2026

Warwickshire County Council has made the above-named Order, the effect of which is to impose a 30mph speed limit on the length of road described in the Schedule below. The Order commences on Monday 28 September 2026.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within six weeks from the date of the making of the Order apply to the High Court for this purpose.

(formerly part of the A423 Banbury Road, Southam, opposite Starbold Farm)

From its junction with the A423 Banbury Road, northwards for its entire length, being a distance of approximately 200 metres.
